

Ant

(Focus: Left hand third finger/mixing quarter and eighth note rhythms)

Exciting New Sound:

The sound marked (▲) is made by scraping the 'i' finger of the right hand down through all six strings just behind the bridge. Ants can remind us of soldiers marching. The sound you make here is like a military snare drum, keeping the ants in rhythm as they march.

Practice Tips:

Begin by clapping the rhythm to Ant before you try to play it on the guitar. Once the rhythm is secure, alternate your focus between right hand finger switching and using the tip of your left hand third finger to play the D note.

As in Fly, begin practicing Ant by playing only the standard notes, leaving out the marching sound.
